The meeting was called to order by Board of Public Works Chair Tony Thier at 4:30 pm.

Review and Recommendation – Raze Permit for 200 1st Avenue North – JR Industrial has applied for a permit to raze portions of the former paper mill property. Based on the map, the proposed area to be demolished is believed to be greater than 100,000 cubic feet, which means the committee needs to make a recommendation to the Council for approval. Applicant would be obligated to follow the provisions and have also requested an irrevocable letter of credit that shall not be less than 120% of the project cost. Asbestos survey is currently underway, and they will submit report when available. Certificate of insurance expired at the end of January and needs to be renewed. Questions for the contractor include: what condition the property will be left in when the work is complete; what are they going to do with lower levels of the pulp mill that go down to the river; what are they going to be using as fill for those lower levels; how much is demo and how much is scrap/salvage; and are they going to make it walkable/drivable? City will request clarification on parking lot material as well as the truck route that should be used for demolition. They must maintain access and roof over the hydro dam and make sure that they notify the owner. Additionally, the irrevocable line of credit is guarantee that they leave the property in the condition required.

Motion by Mader/Thier to recommend that the Common Council consider the raze permit after questions posed have been answered and we seek legal counsel from attorney Schoenborn. Motion carried, 3-0.

Motion by Mader/Wilson to recommend to the Common Council that the Chief of Police allow demolition crew to work 7 days/week. Motion carried, 3-0.

PUBLIC COMMENT – Gary Wollerman noted that a local breeder appeared on the Westminster national dog show with Smokey, the American Water Spaniel, and Park Falls was mentioned during the sporting group.

NEW BUSINESS

- A. CSM – 344 Sherry Avenue & 350 Birch Street – CSM adjusts a portion of the property line between these two properties by three feet. Recommendation for approval from the Plan Commission. Motion by Greenwood/Wilson to approve. Motion carried.
- B. Review of City Owned Properties – Discussion on the future of eight city-owned parcels at the request of Alder Weidman. Motion by Mader/Wilson to relist Tax ID 23492 for \$7,500, open to negotiation. Motion carried. Motion by Wilson/Mader to list Tax ID 23476 & 23477 combined as one parcel at \$10,000, for structural use only. Motion carried. 23686 has water and sewer readily available. Would consider another RFP and rezone on 23552. 23684 and 23559 discussed. Ashland County PIN 006-00143-000 has an active permit for gravel.

Finance

1. Payment of Bills – Motion by Bukachek/Weidman to approve paying the bills in the amount of \$102,700.55. Motion carried, 7-0.

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE ITEMS

- A. Review and Recommendation of Concealed Carry Ordinance – Discovered that some of the facilities that the ordinance covers are not properly signed, so the ordinance is therefore not enforceable.

Additionally, the City cannot prohibit concealed carry in open air locations unless there is a special event occurring, and the prohibition is properly noticed. City Hall, Fire, Police, Pool, Library, DPW Garage, DNR Building, Airport Terminal Bldg. No unauthorized personnel stickers for other buildings.

DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS

Mayor -Met with Rob Summerfeld this last week at the League meeting. Discussion at the league level about imposing a local sales tax.

Jody Eckert – Excited to be part of a very vibrant and busy Library. Live Planning Series: Session One scheduled for February 24th at 3:00 with presentation by Speer law office on estate planning and elder law. Celebration of life for former Librarian on February 21st at the Library.

Becky Michels – Auditors will be on site Tuesday and Wednesday of this week.

Bill Hoffman - Notified 20 plus residents of the Let-Run order last week, and there have been no additional freeze-ups since.

Shannon Greenwood – There is not a February primary for Park Falls. Finished the Illness/Injury reports for 2025 on Monday.

Chief Nevelier – It has been quiet with the cold weather, and there have not been too many snowmobile issues just a few off the route.

Chief Reas – Provided mutual aid for two fires in Phillips last week.

At 6:21 p.m. there was a motion by Alderman Weidman and seconded by Alderman Wilson to convene into closed session, pursuant to Wisconsin State Statutes 19.85(1)(e) Deliberating or negotiating the purchasing of public properties the investing of public funds, or conducting other specified public business, whenever competitive or bargaining reasons require a closed session. - C. Raze Permit – 200 1st Avenue North – Application submitted by demolition contractor for portions of the property. This will be the 3rd papermill they will have done demolition on. Applicant is requesting an exemption from Ordinance 354-9 (B)(5). Recommendation from Public Works committee to consider the proposed permit after questions were addressed by demolition contractor, including the requirement of a bond. Motion by Weidman/Wilson to approve the permit on condition that they secure a bond in the amount of \$1,000,000. Motion carried. Motion by Wilson Bukachek to allow working through the weekends during the established hours. Motion carried.
- D. Ordinance 26-002 Amending Requirement on Building Code 209-3 – Motion by Wartgow/Corbett to adopt Ordinance 26-002. Motion carried.

Re: Revised Weed Ordinances

Enclosed you will find revised weed and grass ordinances that simplifies and combines two existing ordinances into one and eliminates the other (the old ordinances are included for your reference). It is embarrassing at times when someone asks “what does this mean?”, and I have to say “Heck if I know.” So, this is an effort to make the process simpler by not having two separate ordinances, eliminates a listing of “weeds” which include at least some that are no longer considered “noxious.” In addition, the revised ordinance also lowers the length of rank vegetation to six inches from the current eight inches. This gives us a little more time to respond and get notices out to offenders. I would expect that vegetation would be well over six inches before the initial cutting takes place.

I encourage you approve the revised ordinance as part of the goal to purge unnecessary bureaucracy.

ORDINANCE NO. 26-003

SECTION 360-1: DESTRUCTION OF NOXIOUS WEEDS

The Common Council of the City of Park Falls ordains the amendment of Section 360-1, "Destruction of Noxious Weeds," of the Municipal Code, as follows:

Section 1: Section 360-1 of the Municipal Code of the City of Park Falls is hereby Amended to read as follows:

Sec. 360-1. CONTROL OF NOXIOUS WEEDS AND GRASSES.

- A. Notice. The City Clerk or their designee shall annually publish by May 15 of each year a Class 2 notice that every person is required by law to destroy all noxious weeds on lands in the City which they own, occupy, or control. The City Clerk or their designee may utilize a joint notice with another municipality.
- B. Unsightly Growth and Foliage.
1. As used in this Section 360-1, "unsightly growth and foliage" means:
 - a) Noxious weeds as defined in Wis. Stat. § 66.0407(1)(b), including any weed the City declares by ordinance or resolution to be noxious;
 - b) Grass over six (6) inches in height;
 - c) Rank growth of vegetation; or
 - d) The accumulation of unsightly weeds.
 2. The Weed Commissioner and/or their appointee shall determine when unsightly growth and foliage of any nature is, in their discretion, detrimental to the appearance, neatness, safety, health, or cleanliness of a neighborhood and shall notify the person owning, occupying, or controlling the property in one of the following ways:
 - a) In writing, by mailing said notice to the person's last known address, notifying them that the accumulation of such unsightly growth and foliage is in violation of this Section 360-1 and that said person has ten (10) days from the date that the notice was postmarked to cut said accumulation of unsightly growth and foliage; or
 - b) By placing a door hanger on the primary structure, notifying them that the accumulation of such unsightly growth and foliage is in violation of this Section 360-1 and that said person has five (5) days from the date that the notice was placed to cut said accumulation of unsightly growth and foliage.
 3. If the owner, occupant, or person in control of the property has not cut the unsightly growth and foliage and fully complied with the order prior to the expiration of the notice period, then the Weed Commissioner and/or their appointee can direct the proper authorities within the City to have the unsightly growth and foliage be cut. The cost of cutting, disposing of the unsightly growth and foliage, and necessary administrative costs shall be the responsibility of the owner, occupant, or person in control of the property, who shall be invoiced for the cost. If the invoice is not paid in full by October 31, it shall be charged against the property and collected as a special tax thereon.
- C. Due Process Hearing. If the owner, occupant, or person in control of the property wishes to object to an order issued under Section 360-1, such person must do so in writing prior to the expiration

of the notice period and deliver such objection to the City Clerk's office. A hearing shall then be held before the Common Council at the next available meeting, and the Common Council shall determine the propriety of the order issued under this Section 360-1.

- D. Penalty. In addition to being responsible for the costs of cutting, any owner, occupant, or person in charge of the property which does not comply with an order under this Section 360-1 within the required time period or who otherwise violates the provisions of this article may be subject to the general penalty found in Section 1-2.

Section 2: If any section, clause, provision, or portion of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction or by any agency or of any kind by anyone else, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected.

Section 3: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 4: This Ordinance shall take effect and be in effect after passage and publication according to law.

ORDINANCE NO. 26-004

SECTION 360-2: LENGTH OF LAWN AND GRASSES

The Common Council of the City of Park Falls ordains the repeal of Section 360-2, "Length of Lawn and Grasses," of the Municipal Code, as follows:

Section 1: Section 360-2 of the Municipal Code of the City of Park Falls is hereby repealed and shall read as follows:

Sec. 360-2. (reserved for future use).

Section 2: If any section, clause, provision, or portion of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction or by any agency or of any kind by anyone else, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected.

Section 3: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 4: This Ordinance shall take effect and be in effect after passage and publication according to law.

Chapter 360. Property Maintenance

Article I. Brush, Grass and Weeds

§ 360-1. Destruction of noxious weeds.

- A. The City Clerk or Treasurer shall annually on or before May 15th publish as required by state law a notice that every person is required by law to destroy all noxious weeds on lands in the City which he owns, occupies or controls. A joint notice with other towns or municipalities may be utilized.
- B. If the owner or occupant shall neglect to destroy any weeds as required by such notice, then the Weed Commissioner of the City shall give five days' written notice by mail to the owner or occupant of any lands upon which the weeds shall be growing to the effect that the said Weed Commissioner after the expiration of the five-day period will proceed to destroy or cause to be destroyed all such weeds growing upon said lands and that the cost thereof will be assessed as a tax upon the lands upon which such weeds are located under the provisions of § 66.0517, Wis. Stats. In case the owner or occupant shall further neglect to comply within such five-day notice, then the Weed Commissioner shall destroy such weeds or cause them to be destroyed in the manner deemed to be the most economical method and the expense thereof, including the cost of billing and other necessary administrative expenses, shall be charged against such lots and be collected as a special tax thereon.

[Amended at time of adoption of Code (see Ch. 1, General Provisions, Art. II)]

- C. As provided for in § 66.0407(4), Wis. Stats., the City shall require that all noxious weeds shall be destroyed prior to the time in which such plants would mature to the bloom or flower state. The growth of noxious weeds in excess of eight inches in height from the ground surface shall be prohibited within the City corporate limits. Noxious weeds shall include any weed, grass or similar plant growth which, if allowed to pollinate, would cause or produce hay fever in human beings or would cause a skin rash through contact with the skin.

(1) Noxious weeds, as defined in this section and in § 360-2, shall include but not be limited to the following:

- (a) *Cirsium Arvense* (Canada Thistle).
- (b) *Ambrosia artemisiifolia* (Common Ragweed).
- (c) *Ambrosia trifida* (Great Ragweed).
- (d) *Euphorbia esula* (Leafy Spurge).
- (e) *Convolvulus arvensis* (Creeping Jenny) (Field Bind Weed).
- (f) *Tragopogon dubius* (Goat's Beard).
- (g) *Rhus radicans* (Poison Ivy).
- (h) *Cirsium vulgaries* (Bull Thistle).
- (i) *Pastinaca sativa* (Wild Parsnip).
- (j) *Arctium minus* (Burdock).
- (k) *Xanthium strumarium* (Cocklebur).
- (l) *Amaranthus retroflexus* (Pigweed).
- (m) *Chenopodium album* (Common Lambsquarter).
- (n) *Rumex Crispus* (Curled Dock).
- (o) *Cannabis sativa* (Hemp).
- (p) *Plantago lanceolata* (English Plantain).

(2) Noxious grasses, as defined in this section and in § 360-2, shall include but not be limited to the following:

- (a) *Agrostia alba* (Redtop).

- (b) *Dactylis glomerata* (Orchard).
 - (c) *Phleum pratensis* (Timothy).
 - (d) *Poa pratensis* (Kentucky Blue).
 - (e) *Sorghum halepense* (Johnson).
 - (f) *Setaria* (Foxtail).
- (3) Noxious weeds are also the following plants and other rank growth:
- (a) Ragweed.
 - (b) Thistles.
 - (c) Smartweed.
 - (d) Dandelions (over 10 inches in height).
 - (e) Milkweed (over 10 inches in height).

§ 360-2. Length of lawn and grasses.

- A. Purpose. This section is adopted due to the unique nature of the problems associated with lawns, grasses and noxious weeds being allowed to grow to excessive length in the City of Park Falls.
- B. Public nuisance declared. The Common Council finds that lawns, grasses and noxious weeds on lots or parcels of land which exceed eight inches in length adversely affect the public health and safety of the public in that they tend to emit pollen and other discomfoting bits of plants, constitute a fire hazard and a safety hazard in that debris can be hidden in the grass, interferes with the public convenience and adversely affects property values of other land within the City. Any lawn, grass or weed on a lot or other parcel of land which exceeds eight inches in length is hereby declared to be a public nuisance, except.
- (1) Property located in a designated floodplain area and/or wetland area;
 - (2) Where the lawn, grass or weed is part of a natural lawn approved pursuant to Article II below; or
 - (3) Undeveloped lots within the City's industrial park.
- C. Nuisances prohibited. No person, firm or corporation shall permit any public nuisance as defined in Subsection **B** above to remain on any premises owned or controlled by him within the City.
- D. Inspection. The Weed Commissioner or his designee shall inspect or cause to be inspected all premises and places within the City to determine whether any public nuisance as defined in Subsection **B** above exists.
- E. Abatement of nuisance.
- (1) If the Weed Commissioner shall determine with reasonable certainty that any public nuisance as defined in Subsection **B** above exists, he shall immediately cause written notice to be served that the City proposes to have the lot grass or lawn cut so as to conform with this section and § 360-1.
 - (2) The notice shall be served at least five days prior to the date of the hearing and shall be mailed or served on the owner of the lot or parcel of land or, if he is not known and there is a tenant occupying the property, then to the tenant, of the time and place at which the hearing will be held.
- F. Due process hearing. If the owner believes that his grasses or weeds are not a nuisance, he may request a hearing before the Common Council. The request for said hearing must be made in writing to the City Clerk or Treasurer's office within the five days set forth in the Weed Commissioner's notice. Upon application for the hearing, the property owner must deposit a \$25 bond. If a decision is rendered in the property owner's favor, the \$25 will be returned to the property owner. If the property owner fails to appear for the hearing or if the decision is rendered against the property owner, the deposit shall be forfeited and applied to the cost of City personnel abating the nuisance, if necessary. When a hearing is requested by the owner of the property, a hearing by the Common Council shall be held within seven days from the date of the owner's request. The property in question will not be mowed by the City until such time as the hearing is held by the Council. At the hearing, the owner may appear in person or by his attorney, may present witnesses in his own behalf and may cross-examine witnesses presented by the City as well as subpoena witnesses for his own case. At the close of the hearing, the Common Council shall make its determination in writing specifying its findings, facts, and conclusions. If the Common Council determines that a public nuisance did exist, the Council shall order the Weed Commissioner to mow the property in question unless the property has been mowed by the owner within 48 hours of the Common Council's decision. If the owner does not abate the nuisance within the described 48 hours, the Weed Commissioner shall cause the same nuisance to be abated and cost in excess of the forfeited fee assessed accordingly.

G. City's enforcement of ordinance. In a case where the owner, occupant or person in charge of the property fails to cut their lawn, grass or weeds as set forth above, then, in that event, the City, by the Weed Commissioner, shall have a written notice issued by mail giving the owner, occupant or person in charge of the property seven days from the date of a written notice to abate this nuisance. The owner, occupant or person in charge of the property shall be given only one notice to abate the nuisance per growing season. The growing season shall be from May first to October first of each calendar year. In the event the aforementioned violation is not corrected within seven days of the date of the written notice to the owner, occupant or person in charge of the property that person shall be cited and fined for this violation subject to the general penalty found in § 1-2 of the Code. Any second or subsequent violation of this ordinance at the same property by the same owner, occupant or person in charge of the property during the same growing season shall be issued an additional citation for the violation of this ordinance.

H. Penalty.

- (1) Any owner, occupant or person in charge of the property which does not abate the nuisance within the required time period or who otherwise violates the provisions of this article shall be subject to the general penalty found in § 1-2.

ORDINANCE NO. 26-005

SECTION 354-4: POSSESSIONS OF FIREARMS IN CERTAIN BUILDINGS

The Common Council of the City of Park Falls ordains the amendment of Section 354-4, "Carrying Concealed Weapons Prohibited; Certain Weapons Prohibited," of the Municipal Code, as follows:

Section 1: Section 354-4 of the Municipal Code of the City of Park Falls is hereby Amended to read as follows:

Sec. 354-4. POSSESSION OF FIREARMS AND WEAPONS IN CERTAIN BUILDINGS.

- A. DEFINITIONS. The following definitions shall apply to this Section.
1. "Firearm." A weapon or any instrument used in the propulsion of a bullet, shot, slug, or other projectile by acts of gunpowder.
 2. "Law Enforcement Officer." Any person employed by the State of Wisconsin or any political subdivision of this State, for the purpose of detecting and preventing crime and enforcing the laws or ordinances and who is authorized to make arrests for violations of the laws or ordinances he or she is employed to enforce.
 3. "Weapon." A dangerous implement including, but not limited to a firearm, an electric weapon as defined in Section 941.295(1c)(a), Wis. Stats., a knife other than a switchblade as defined in Section 941.24, Wis. Stats., or a billy club.
- B. POSSESSION OF WEAPONS PROHIBITED IN CERTAIN BUILDINGS.
1. In addition to the provisions of Wisconsin Statutes, including but not limited Section 175.60, Wis. Stats., enumerating places and locations where the carrying of a weapon or firearm is prohibited, including an exceptions thereto, it shall be unlawful for any person other than a law enforcement officer to enter the following City of Park Falls municipal buildings while carrying a weapon or firearm:
 - a) The Park Falls City Hall and the Park Falls Public Library.
 - b) The Park Falls Police Station.
 - c) The Park Falls Fire Station.
 - d) The Park Falls Municipal Airport Terminal.
 - e) The Park Falls City Garage.
 - f) The Park Falls Community Pool.
 - g) The Park Falls Department of Public Works Building.
 - h) The Park Falls "DNR Building" at 84 Case Ave (that being the building approximately 70 feet from the centerline of Case Ave.).
 2. It shall be unlawful for any person other than a law enforcement officer to enter any building, facility, or location open to the public that is posted as a no-firearm or concealed weapons location while possessing, carrying, or concealing a firearm or weapon, whether with or without a State permit.
 3. Signs of at least 5 inches by 7 inches in size that meet the requirements of Section 943.13(2)(bm)(1), Wis. Stats., shall be posted in prominent places near public entrances to all municipal buildings listed above providing notice that no person is to enter or remain in any such building while carrying a firearm or weapon.

4. The Chief of Police, at his or her discretion, may issue a written exemption following application to have temporary possession of a firearm or weapon within a City-owned building upon written application providing a legitimate educational purpose or safety reason as a basis for the exemption.
5. The City Administrator is authorized and directed to make such changes to the City of Park Falls Employee handbook to prohibit the use or possession of a firearm or weapon while on duty, except law enforcement officers and those authorized by the Chief of Police, while making such necessary exceptions and amendments to comply with Section 175.60(15m), Wis. Stats., and such other and future laws or binding judicial precedent.
6. Nothing in this Section shall be construed to authorize the carrying of any firearm or weapon contrary to Wisconsin Statute Sections 941.23 or 941.235.

C. POSSESSION, SALE, AND MANUFACTURE OF CERTAIN WEAPONS PROHIBITED.

1. No person shall sell, manufacture, purchase, possess or carry a “Num-chuk” (also called a “Nunchaku”), a “Churkin,” or a “Suchbai” or similar weapon within the City of Park Falls.
2. For the purposes of this Section, the following definitions shall apply:
 - a) “Num-chuk” or Nunchaku. An instrument consisting of two or more sticks, clubs, or rods connected by a rope, cord, wire, or chain.
 - b) “Churkin.” A round throwing knife consisting of several sharp points protruding from a rounded disk.
 - c) “Suchbai.” A short length of wood or metal or other similar hardened material which, when gripped in the hand, protrudes on either side of the fist. Such prohibited instruments may or may not have spikes or short pointed protrusions from either end.

D. PENALTIES.

1. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Section shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit not less than \$100 nor more than \$500, plus court and other costs including actual attorney fees, for each separation violation, and shall further be subject to penalty for trespass under Section 943.13, Wis. Stats.

Section 2: If any section, clause, provision, or portion of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction or by any agency or of any kind by anyone else, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected.

Section 3: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 4: This Ordinance shall take effect and be in effect after passage and publication according to law.

Enclosed you will find a revised fire department ordinance for your consideration. I happened upon this ordinance and noted that there were a few items that were not consistent with current practice. As such, I reviewed these proposed changes with Chief Reas. It is important that our ordinances and practices are in sync.

The changes from the current ordinance, which I have included for your reference, are: (1) Noting that Fire Department officers are as outlined in the bylaws and the number of fire fighters are as the Chief deems necessary and as allowed by the budget; (2) applications should be made at City Hall as we need to be aware of newly hired members and assure that proper hiring practices are followed as well as removing the requirement that applicants be approved by the Council; and (3) removing the 2.5 mile residency requirement.

Please let me know if you have any questions regarding this proposed ordinance.

ORDINANCE NO. 26-006

**SECTION 62-1: FIRE DEPARTMENT ORGANIZATION; GOALS OF
DEPARTMENT**

The Common Council of the City of Park Falls ordains the amendment of Section 62-1, "Fire Department organization; goals of Department," of the Municipal Code, as follows:

Section 1: Section 62-1 of the Municipal Code of the City of Park Falls is hereby Amended to read as follows:

Sec. 62-1. FIRE DEPARTMENT ORGANIZATION; GOALS OF DEPARTMENT.

- A. Fire Department established. The Park Falls Fire Department shall be responsible for the program of fire defense for the citizens and property within the City of Park Falls. The duty of said Department shall be that of firefighting and the prevention of fires in the City of Park Falls and townships in Price County contracting for the service of the Department.
- B. Goals of the Fire Defense Program.
 - 1. The primary objective of the fire defense program is to serve all citizens, without prejudice or favoritism, by safeguarding, collectively and individually, their lives against the effects of fires and explosions.
 - 2. The second objective of the fire defense program is to safeguard the general economy and welfare of the community by preventing major conflagrations and the destruction by fire of industries and businesses.
 - 3. The third objective of the fire defense program is to protect the property of all citizens against the effects of fire and explosions. All property deserves equal protection, regardless of location or monetary value.
- C. Department to adopt bylaws. The Park Falls Fire Department shall adopt bylaws for the control, management and government and for the regulation of business and proceedings of the Department, which bylaws shall be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the Department members and approved by the Common Council. Amendments shall be adopted in the same manner.
- D. Funds appropriated. The Common Council shall appropriate funds to provide for operation and for such apparatus and equipment for the use of the Fire Department as it may deem expedient and necessary to maintain efficiency and properly protect life and property from fire.
- E. Membership.
 - 1. The Fire Department shall consist of at least one Fire Chief and such additional officers as provided for and set forth in the Fire Department's bylaws. Furthermore, the Fire Department shall consist of as many members as deemed necessary by the Chief taking into account the Fire Department's needs and budgetary constraints.
 - 2. Any person desiring to be a member of the Fire Department may file an application at City Hall in such form as the Common Council may require. Applicants must be at least 18 years old.
 - 3. All resignations from the Fire Department shall be submitted to the Fire Chief.

4. Active membership in the Fire Department shall cease when physically unable to perform the duties of the position, after which such members shall become honorary members.
 5. All members, officers, and employees of the Fire Department shall be subject to the same expectations, standards, and conditions set forth in the employee handbook for the City, including but not limited to the provisions pertaining to discipline and the grievance procedure, as may be amended from time to time.
- F. General rules governing officers. The election of officers shall be held at the annual meeting of the Fire Department in such manner as is provided in the bylaws. In case of any vacancy, the Fire Chief will appoint a member in good standing to fill the office until the next annual election.

Section 2: If any section, clause, provision, or portion of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction or by any agency or of any kind by anyone else, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected.

Section 3: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

§ 62-1. Fire Department organization; goals of Department.

- A. Fire Department established. The Park Falls Fire Department shall be responsible for the program of fire defense for the citizens and property within the City of Park Falls. The duty of said Department shall be that of firefighting and the prevention of fires in the City of Park Falls and townships in Price County contracting for the service of the department.
- B. Goals of the fire defense program.
- (1) The primary objective of the fire defense program is to serve all citizens, without prejudice or favoritism, by safeguarding, collectively and individually, their lives against the effects of fires and explosions.
 - (2) The second objective of the fire defense program is to safeguard the general economy and welfare of the community by preventing major conflagrations and the destruction by fire of industries and businesses.
 - (3) The third objective of the fire defense program is to protect the property of all citizens against the effects of fire and explosions. All property deserves equal protection, regardless of location or monetary value.
- C. Department to adopt bylaws. The Park Falls Fire Department shall adopt bylaws for the control, management and government and for the regulation of business and proceedings of the Department, which bylaws shall be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the Department members and approved by the Common Council. Amendments shall be adopted in the same manner.
- D. Funds appropriated. The Common Council shall appropriate funds to provide for operation and for such apparatus and equipment for the use of the Fire Department as it may deem expedient and necessary to maintain efficiency and properly protect life and property from fire.
- E. Membership.
- (1) The Fire Department shall consist of the following officers: one chief, an assistant chief, a captain and lieutenant for each company, and a treasurer, training/safety officer and secretary, together with one mechanic, and as many drivers and firemen, who are residents of the City of Park Falls, as may be appointed by the

Mayor, with the approval of the Council, provided that at no time shall the Department consist of fewer than 28 active members, including officers.

- (2) Any person desiring to be a member of the Fire Department may file an application with the Secretary in such form as the Common Council may require. Applicants must be at least 18 years old. The name of any applicant approved by the Fire Department shall be presented to the Common Council for confirmation.
 - (3) All resignations from the Fire Department shall be submitted to the Fire Chief.
 - (4) Active membership in the Fire Department shall cease when physically unable to perform the duties of the position, after which such members shall become honorary members.
 - (5) All members, officers, and employees of the Fire Department shall be subject to the same expectations, standards, and conditions set forth in the employee handbook for the City, including but not limited to the provisions pertaining to discipline and the grievance procedure, as may be amended from time to time. [Amended 12-14-2020 by Ord. No. 20-005]
 - (6) All members of the Fire Department must reside within a 2.5 mile radius of the municipal building/fire hall within six months of appointment.
- F. General rules governing officers. The election of officers shall be held at the annual meeting of the Fire Department in such manner as is provided in the bylaws. In case of any vacancy, the Fire Chief will appoint a member in good standing to fill the office until the next annual election.

§ 62-2. Police power of the Department; inspection of fire equipment. [Amended 6-12-2023 by Ord. No. 23-004]

A. Police authority at fires.

- (1) The Fire Chief and assistants or officers in command at any fire and hereby vested with full and complete police authority at fires. Any officer of the Department may cause the arrest of any person failing to give the right-of-way to the Fire Department in responding to a fire.
- (2) The Fire Chief may prescribe certain limits in the vicinity of any fire within which no persons, excepting firemen and policemen and those admitted by order of any officer of the Department, shall be permitted to come.
- (3) The Chief shall have the power to cause the removal of any property whenever it shall become necessary for the preservation of such property from fire or to prevent the spreading of fire or to protect the adjoining property, and during the progress of any fire he shall have the power to cause the removal of all wires or other facilities and the turning off of all electricity or other services where the same impedes the work of the Department during the progress of a fire.

B. Fire inspection duties.

- (1) The Fire Chief of Park Falls Fire and Rescue shall have the power to appoint one or more deputy fire inspectors and shall perform all duties required of the fire inspector by the laws of the state and the rules of the Department of Safety and Professional services, particularly § 101.14, Wisconsin State Statues. **[Amended at time of adoption of Code (see Ch. 1, General Provisions, Art. I)]**
- (2) While acting as Fire Inspector, pursuant to § 101.14 Wis. Stats., the Fire Chief or any officer of the Fire Department designated by the Fire Chief, shall have the right and authority to enter any building or upon any premises in the City of Park Falls at all reasonable hours for the purpose making inspections or investigations which, under this Code of Ordinances, he/she may deem necessary. Should the Fire Inspector find that any provisions of this Code relating to fire hazards and prevention of fires is being violated, or that a fire hazard exists which should be eliminated, it shall be his/her duty to give such directions for the abatement of such conditions as he/she shall deem necessary and if such directions be not compiled with, to report such noncompliance to the City Council for further action.
- (3) The Chief of the Fire Department is required, by himself/herself or by officers or members of the Fire Department designated by him/her as fire inspectors, to inspect all buildings, premises, and public thoroughfares, except the interiors of private dwellings, for the purpose of ascertaining and causing to be corrected any conditions liable to cause fire, or any violations of any law or ordinance relating to the prevention or fires. Pursuant to the Wisconsin Administrative Code Chapter SPS 314.01(13)(b)7, the Chief of the Fire Department is authorized to reduce the frequency of fire inspections required under Wisconsin Administrative Code Chapter SPS 314.01(13)(b)3 to at least once per calendar year, provided the interval between those inspections does not exceed 15 months. The Chief of the Fire Department may require or conduct more frequent inspection than required under this subsection.
- (4) Written reports of inspections shall be made and kept on file in the office of the Chief of Park Falls Fire and Rescue in the manner or form required by the Department of Safety and Professional Services. A copy of such reports shall be filed with the Fire Chief. **[Amended at time of adoption of Code (see Ch. 1, General Provisions, Art. I)]**
